

Certificated Sites and Certificated Locations

Background

Certificated Sites and Certificated Locations (CLs and CSs) are small, privately-owned caravan and motorhome sites that can allocate pitches for up to a maximum of 5 caravan or motorhomes at a time.

According to evidence provided by the UK Caravan and Camping Alliance (UKCCA), in the summer of 2018 there were 3,677 CLs and CSs operating in the UK, accounting for 18,385 pitches.

As part of the 2019 Economic Benefits Report: Campsites and Holiday Parks – UK11, a survey was undertaken with a sample2 of these sites. This was to better understand their contribution to the wider holiday park sector.

Analysis showed that CLs and CSs provide a range of onsite facilities including:

- toilet blocks (53%)
- shower blocks (41%)
- Wi-Fi (38%)
- laundry (11%)

Other facilities mentioned included; hardstandings, electric hook ups, motorhome service points and dishwashing facilities.

62% of these sites were open all year round with 38% seasonal.

Engagement with the local community

CLs and CSs engage with the local community in a number of ways:

- local events promotion, sponsorship and signposting
- working with community groups and community councils
- leaflets and local information

"Donations to local charities of prizes and money, support the local Gairloch Gathering by providing the ground and helping with purchasing goods".

Support for the environment

These sites support the local environment by:

- recycling, including visitor guidance
- encouraging local wildlife
- providing compost toilets
- planting trees and shrubs

"We offer recycling of most materials. We planted an orchard of standard fruit trees. Our site is all grass & some areas are left rough through the summer for insects & birds"

Supporting visitors' health and wellbeing

CL and CS sites also encourage visitors' health and wellbeing, in the following ways:

- access to cycle paths and walks in the surrounding area
- promotion of local health and wellbeing facilities within the wider community
- provision of site grown fruit and veg

Economic contribution

It is estimated that in 2018 visitors to CL and CS sites spent a total of £101m in the UK economy, supporting 1,874 FTE jobs and contributing £58m of GVA.

In addition to the above, CL and CS sites also contribute to the economy through the ongoing costs of maintaining and improving their sites. These sites spent, on average, £29,667 on park assets in 2017-2018. Factoring this up to the total number of CLs and CSs in the UK this equates to a potential capital spend of £109m.

Looking to the future, sites planned to spend, on average, a further £1,679 on maintenance and £2,002 on improvements over the next 3 years. Factoring this up to the total number of CLs and CSs in the UK this equates to a potential future spend of £13.5m on both maintenance and improvements.
